PET INSURANCE: A VET'S PERSPECTIVE

The Cost of Owning a Pet: Making the Case for Pet Insurance

Our pets give us comfort and companionship beyond all expectation, and we give back to them with love and care. However, as we treat our pets more and more like children, the cost to care for them goes up too. Unfortunately, most of us can't provide our pets with absolutely everything we would like. Does he need the high-end boutique pet food or is the grocery store brand ok? Can he go another year without a dental cleaning or not? Will you pursue chemotherapy and radiation treatment if he gets cancer? Can we give them the best of everything while still living within our own budget?

Estimates of the cost of owning a dog or cat vary from \$500-\$2000 per year just for the basics like food, toys and routine veterinary care. Any special medical needs could increase costs a lot. Advances in veterinary care allow you to give your pet a better and longer life, but that advanced care does cost more. How can you prepare to afford whatever they might need? If your pet ends up in an emergency hospital and you're quoted \$10,000 for life-saving surgery, could you do it?

In recent years, pet insurance has become a viable option. You can get a policy that covers just emergency care and illness, or one that covers routine care as well. Some veterinary hospitals are even offering their own wellness plans that allow you to pay monthly for your pet's care throughout the year. For instance, you might pay a monthly fee of \$30, which could cover all your dog's required vaccinations, heartworm tests, etc. for the year. Each plan is different, so you have to spend time doing some research. Your veterinarian may have information on their favorite insurance provider.

Pet Insurance, cont.

Before becoming a shelter vet, I worked in regular veterinary practice. The hardest situations were those where a pet had a serious problem that the owners could not afford. Sometimes we were able to come up with an alternate plan for the pet or for payment, but sometimes the owner just couldn't afford the care. What hurt me most was not only a pet with a problem I couldn't fix but being called greedy and cold-hearted because I couldn't fix their pet for a reduced cost. The stress of giving all you can yet being seen as selfish is partly why the veterinary profession has a much higher suicide rate than the general public.

Every veterinarian I know has given away service for free, has offered payment plans but never been paid, or has come up with creative alternatives for a pet owner in need. Unfortunately, there are too many people in need, and our pockets are not deep enough to sustain that kind of giving forever. With the rising cost of veterinary school and student loan debts as large as a home mortgage; with competition from online pharmacies and overthe-counter flea/tick products; and with shelters like PMHS doing such a good job spaying and neutering pets before adoption; it keeps getting harder for veterinarians to make a living.

I'm not sure that we should move veterinary medicine towards the all-consuming insurance coverage used in human medicine, but perhaps there is a middle ground. The current pet insurance market is now broad enough to offer choices, and familiar enough with vets to be used conveniently by owners. If more pets were covered by insurance, more lives would be saved, fewer pets would be relinquished to shelters, and pet illness or injury would not be as grave a situation for a pet owner.

I encourage everyone to investigate pet insurance to see if it's right for you. It might perhaps help you save your pet and your pocket at the same time.


